Basic Residential Trash & Recycling Guidelines

All items must be curbside **BEFORE** 6 AM on the day of your collection.

The safe rule of thumb is put it out the night before.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- For any issues/questions regarding your collection, or to order mobile carts please contact the Township office at 717-792-3505. If your trash/recycling is not collected by 4 p.m. on your pickup day, please notify the Township immediately.
- For collection delays and updates, please sign up for the Township text alert by texting "Hello" to 1-855-976-9968. You can also receive email notifications from Penn Waste by signing up on their website.

TRASH GUIDELINES

- Effective January 1, 2025, one, 64-gallon mobile cart will be collected two times a week on your specified collection day. All residents and commercial businesses utilizing Township trash must use a Penn Waste provided mobile cart. As of January 1st, trash bags and other garbage cans will not be collected curbside. Penn Waste will still accept additional bags if you purchase and place on your extra bag an orange sticker. These stickers cost \$2.00 and are available at all Rutter's in the Township and the West Manchester Township office at 380 E. Berlin Road.
- Mobile carts, extra bags, and large items cannot be sitting against any personal property of the homeowner. Example: mailbox, car, lamp post, utility pole, etc. Items against property will not be collected.
- No Construction Debris will be collected curbside.
- Effective January 1, 2025, residential passenger vehicle tires without a rim will require an additional \$2.00 sticker to be purchased and placed on the tire.

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

- Effective January 1st, all residents and commercial businesses utilizing Township recycling must use a Penn Waste provided mobile cart for all your recycling items.
- Plastic bags will NO LONGER be accepted as the facility cannot process them.
- Recycling is collected <u>once</u> a week on your specified collection day.
- Please refer to page 6, for recycling guidelines.
- Please refer to page 8, for the Yard Waste calendar and page 5, for yard waste guidelines.

BULK ITEM GUIDELINES

- Bulk items are collected once a week on your <u>second</u> collection day. Please refer to page 7, for guidelines. Bulk items are collected by a different truck and will typically get picked up in the afternoon.
- If laying a large item out that contains glass, please put tape in an "X" shape on both sides of glass.

Leaf Vacuum Collection Schedule

Beginning Monday, October 20th and continuing until Wednesday, December 10th, West Manchester Public Works will be collecting organized leaf piles along the curb. During this time, Public Works will provide residents with multiple collections.

Any leaf piles put out AFTER December 10th will not be collected and will be the responsibility of the owner to dispose of appropriately.*

Please follow these DO's and DON'Ts to help for a smooth leaf season....

- DO put leaves in organized piles. Leaves raked or blown randomly onto the street will not be collected.
- DO put leaf piles as close to the curb as possible.
 Leaf piles that cannot be reached with the collection hoses will not be collected.
- DO **NOT** put leaf piles near intersections. These piles create dangerous traffic situations during collection and put both lives and equipment at great risk.
- Do NOT put branches, sticks, decorative grasses, or corn stalks in leaf piles. These items will jam the leaf collection machines and put the equipment out of service.
- Do NOT put grass clippings in leaf piles. Leaf collection is only for leaves.

- Do NOT put leaf piles around obstructions, such as telephone poles or mailboxes. This makes collection difficult and may result in damage to the collection hoses or the mailbox.
- Do NOT put leaf piles near any parked cars. Leaf trucks cannot get close enough for collection without risking potential damage to the parked car and will be left in place.
- Do NOT put pet waste in leaf piles. These piles will be avoided.
- Do NOT put leaf piles on top of decorative stone areas, or on any blocks, bricks, or stones. These items may cause serious damage to the leaf collection machines and cause potential harm to those operating the equipment.
- Do NOT put leaf piles on, or near, storm catch basins. Clogged grates and basins may result in street flooding and create hazardous situations.

*An appropriate way to dispose of your leaves is through the monthly Yard Waste Collection Service. Please see the calendar on page 8, of this edition. This is a yearround service. The last collection date in 2025 will be on December 27th. The 2026 Winter edition will have an updated calendar. It is important you follow the directions for yard waste preparation. See page 5, for instructions on "How to Prepare Yard Waste".

Yard Waste Collection Guidelines

Grass Clippings

Grass clippings are not permitted in your trash or yard waste pick up. The best option is to use a mulching mower and let your grass clippings work for you. Mulched grass provides moisture and nitrogen to keep your lawn looking great. If you don't have a mulching mower, low-cost conversion kits are available that fit most mowers. Another idea is to place grass clippings on your vegetable garden or around your hedges. You can also add grass clippings in a backyard compost bin. There are many varieties of bins in stores or you can make a bin of your own. As a last resort, take your grass to the Resource Recovery Center (minimum \$20 waste disposal fee). The Resource Recovery Center is located at 2651 Blackbridge Road, York, PA 17406. Additionally, please remember to remove any grass clippings that may have been blown into the road. This causes an extreme danger to people riding motorcycles and bicycles. Another issue with grass clippings is they clog up storm drains, causing drainage and flooding issues. The best way for homeowners to avoid costly lawsuits and increased homeowners insurance premiums is to discharge towards your home and away from the road.

How to Prepare Yard Waste

Prepare yard waste with any of these options:

- 1 In a container, which can be emptied
- 2 In a biodegradable paper bag
- 3 Bundle it with biodegradable twine

If you choose to bundle your yard waste, please follow these instructions:

- Bundles are no longer than 5 ft. in length
- Bundles not to exceed 30 lbs. each
- Branches not to exceed 6 inches in diameter

An unlimited number of bags or bundles may be placed at the curb on the scheduled pick up day before 6:00 AM.

By law, as of January 24, 2013, Penn Waste is not allowed to collect your electronic waste.

The Covered Devices Recycling Act prohibits residents and businesses from placing their electronic waste at the curb or in their trash.

Covered devices include: desktop computers, laptops, monitors, computer peripherals (keyboard, mouse, printer, and speakers), televisions, or e-readers that browse the internet.



Bulk Item Guidelines

ACCEPTED MATERIALS – Appliances,

furniture, mattresses, box springs, lawn mowers (oil and gasoline removed), plumbing fixtures such as toilets and sinks, three (3) 4 ft. rolls of carpet (tied).



MATERIALS – Electronic Waste (computers, televisions, etc.) chemicals, stains, liquids, batteries, automobile parts, hazardous waste, tires on rims, commercial/industrial waste, construction materials (drywall, brick, block, lumber, shingles, tiles, concrete). To properly dispose of these items please contact the York County Resource Recovery Center at 845-1066 or www.ycswa.com.



ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS — Items which are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people will not be accepted. Additional trash bags are NOT considered a bulk item.

Electronics Recycling

The York County Solid Waste Authority's Residential Electronics Recycling Program is free and open to York County residents ONLY and is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 8 a.m. to noon at the Small Load Drop-off Facility at the York County Resource Recovery Center. Please note: The Small Load Drop-off Facility is located within the York County Resource Recovery Center campus. The Resource Recovery Center is located at 2651 Blackbridge Road. Enter the Resource Recovery Center's main gate entrance and proceed to the scales. You will be directed to the Small Load Drop-off Facility. If you are recycling a large item that will require more than one person to unload it, please bring a helper with you, as Authority assistance with unloading is not guaranteed. Residents are limited to delivery of five (5) TV's per visit. 

What Type of Building Permit Do You Need? (Residential)

West Manchester Township requires permits for many types of construction and building work to residential structures. Some jobs will require only a "Zoning Permit" and other jobs will require a "Building Permit". These are separate permits with their own application forms. Zoning permits fall under Township rules and Ordinances. Building permits are for jobs that fall under the Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code and require inspection. Keep in mind permits take time to review and process. Please allow up to seven business days for Zoning permits and three weeks for Building permits.

Examples of work REQUIRING A ZONING PERMIT:

- Construction and/or installation of a fence.
- Construction and/or installation of a shed, unattached carport, or unattached garage, under 1,000 square feet.
- Construction and/or installation of a patio, including paver patio or porch with no roof or walls.
- Construction and/or installation of a walkway on the property other than the sidewalk along the street. (This requires a different permit.)
- Construction and/or installation of a deck where the deck is not more than 30" high.
- Widening, replacing, repaving or adding newly paved areas to an existing driveway.



Examples of work REQUIRING A BUILDING PERMIT:

- Building an addition onto your house, including attached garages and carports.
- Above ground and inground swimming pools, even "wall-less" and portable pools! Any pool that can hold 18" needs a permit. If your pool is taken down every year, you need a permit to put it back up every year.
- Adding a roof to a patio, porch, or deck where the roof is attached to the house.
- Construction and/or installation of a deck where the deck is more than 30" from the ground.
- Installation of doors and windows if the new doors and windows are of a different size.
- Upgrading an electrical service.
- The addition or relocation of electrical wiring.
- Plumbing work where the "trap" seal is broken.

Examples of work NOT REQUIRING ANY PERMIT:

- Repair to existing structures such as floorboards in a deck.
- Putting new shingles on your roof.
- Replacing or installing siding on a house.
- Replacing windows and doors with new ones of the same size.
- Replacing a garage door (however, replacing a manual door with an electric door will require an electrical permit).
- Wallpaper, carpet, tile, paint, and interior cabinetry such as kitchen cabinets.

Hiring a Contractor?

Once you hire a contractor, but at least three weeks before work is scheduled to begin, the homeowner or the contractor must apply for a permit. Building permits can take up to 15 business days because they are reviewed by a third party agency. If the contractor applies for the permit, the homeowner must ask the contractor for the permit so it may be posted in the window of the residence. If the contractor does not get a permit, the homeowner is still legally responsible.



Rent A Kid Program

This program provides an opportunity for middle and high school students, in grades 7 through 12, to assist older adults in completing routine light-duty household chores and yard work such as mowing lawns and shoveling snow. The goal of the Rent-A-Kid program is not only to get an important job done, but also to foster friendships between older adults and youth.

Adults age 60 and older in need of assistance with chores can call the Rent-A-Kid coordinator who will provide names and phone numbers for youth in their area. It is the responsibility of the older adult to contact the youth and discuss the job to be done, when it is to be done, the rate of pay for the job, and any other arrangements that need to be made.

Recommended pay rate is at least minimum wage.

However, depending on the type of work and the ability of the older adult to pay, the youth may negotiate a more satisfactory rate of pay.

WEST MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP FIRE DEPARTMENT OFFERS FREE SMOKE & CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS

Do you have working smoke detectors in your home? Are your detectors less than 10 years old? Do you have one on each level and one in each bedroom? If you answered no to any of these questions, then WMTFD can help!

The West Manchester Township Fire Department received a grant from FEMA to provide combination smoke & carbon monoxide detectors to its residents. Residents should have smoke detectors on each level of their home, including the basement and attic as well as one in each bedroom and outside the sleeping area.

Residents may stop by the Township office to pick up their smoke & carbon monoxide detectors during normal business hours. Residents may take as many as they need to make their home compliant with NFPA guidelines. You may also request a member of the WMTFD to come out and perform a safety inspection of your home and install the detectors for you.

Each smoke detector provided is a combination smoke/carbon monoxide detector that has a sealed lithium-ion battery inside that doesn't need to be changed. Each detector is good for 10 years and after 10 years you just need to replace the detector. Detectors should be tested at least once a month to ensure they are still operable.


Bob Sells, 25 Years of Service




