ZONING HEARING CASE

<u>ZHB #21-30 – Hay Street Properties, LP for West Manchester Professional Campus, LLC –</u> requests a special exception §150-171.D for a Truck Motor Freight Terminal (trailer storage); variance §150-353.A to not require access via an arterial road; variance §150-353.C the maximum area of the parcel designed for such use shall be limited to four acres in size (existing parcel 6.75 acres) located at Colony Road (Tax Map: JH; Parcel: 0056T) in the Light Industrial (I-2) zone.

MOTION by: Richard Gordon to recommend the Zoning Hearing Board approve the special exception and variances. SECOND by: David Beecher MOTION PASSED: Unanimously (4-0)

NEW BUSINESS

There were no plans submitted for review by the Planning Commission for this month's meeting.

DISCUSSION

Representatives for WAWA presented a conceptual plan for a WAWA convenience store with gas pumps to replace the Lyndon Diner. The Planning Commissions main concern with the project was traffic, and how it would affect Rt. 30 and Kenneth Rds. The Planning Commission was in favor of the plan if it could meet the Township Ordinances for items such as stormwater and setbacks. Planning Commission recommended them to proceed with filing for their variance for having gas pumps and to have a traffic study completed.

Fred Walters was concerned about motorists speeding on Poplars and Taxville Rds.and wondered if the Planning Commission could do anything to get the Police Department to better enforce the speed limits in this area? Planning Commission felt they didn't have the authority to address this issue.
