Police Chief's Report for February 2025

February 27th, 2025

Dear Board of Supervisors, Manager and staff,

For the month of January, the officers handled 412 incidents as well as 62 vehicle crashes. Officers conducted over 373 traffic stops and issued 131 traffic citations. The officer's made 12 felony arrests. 24 misdemeanor arrests, 13 summary non-traffic arrests and 7 juvenile petitions were also filed.

There are a number of events that are already in the planning stages that are going to require a lot of time and effort. We will be meeting with the staff from the Rock the Country event to make sure we are properly prepared and are ready for the crowds at the Fairgrounds. We will be reporting our progress on this event in the next few months. This event will be the first time this company will be coming to the York area. We will be hosting three days of visitors and campers for the music event that will cover those days. We expect over 50,000 people to visit the event during this time. Shortly after this is over, we will begin to get ready for the greater York State Fair. So our work is cut out for us in the next few months.

The new patrol vehicles have been acquired and are getting deployed as they are finished with the upfitting process. The one patrol car, a Ford Explorer Interceptor, is already in the fleet and being utilized. The vehicle is a gray color. The reason for this is that the color blue is no longer available in this vehicle configuration. We chose the color Gray and we were happy with the results. The next few cars will have to be this

CI Division Report for February 2025 Board Meeting 1/16/2025 through 2/20/2025

Since January 16, 2025, WMTPD Criminal Investigations has taken on 9 new case assignments: 2 ChildLine Referral cases for alleged sexual or physical abuse of children, a request by Baltimore City PD to assist with an Internal Affairs/Ethics Bureau investigation, a PFAD investigation for the relinquishment of firearms subsequent to a PFA Order, a theft investigation involving an elderly resident in a care facility, 3 fraud/theft by deception cases (one phone scam, one case of automotive parts sent to a fictitious business, and one check case on a closed account), and another investigation into a subject illegally recording staff interactions — this time at the West York School District Administration building.

During the same time frame, our office has formally closed out 7 investigations: 1 PICS case, 5 investigations into physical/sexual abuse of children or alleged sexual exploitation of children, and the above-listed theft involving the elderly care facility resident.

In addition to the above, during this time frame Detective Davenport completed the 2025 PA Treasury submission for unclaimed property and currency.
