

**3RD QUARTER (JULY 1-SEPT 30)** - Bills generated in July


**4TH QUARTER (OCT 1- DEC 31)** - Bills generated in October

Our contract with Penn Waste, which was effective January 1, 2025, locks in the \$96.00 per unit for 5 years.

### **1. ONLINE OR BY PHONE USING CIVIC PAY**

Click on the Civic Pay Payment Portal link on the website and pay by credit/debit. You can set up Auto Pay through the Civic Pay Payment Portal. A phone payment can be made by calling 717-801-1219. You will need your account number.

### **2. AUTOMATED CLEARING HOUSE (ACH) OR DIRECT DEBIT**

The Township can direct debit a checking or savings account for your quarterly sewer/ trash payments. The Automatic Debit Form is available under "forms" on the website. Complete and return the form along with a voided check to the Township building. This form must be returned ONE month prior to the quarterly billing cycle to ensure your account will be debited properly. You must notify us immediately if your account number or any changes occur with the account to be debited. Failure to notify us will result in late fees and a nonsufficient fund charge applied to your account.

### **3. BY MAIL**

your trash or yard waste pick up.**

### **How To Dispose of Grass Clippings:**

- Use a mulching mower
- Place clippings on your vegetable garden or in  
a backyard compost bin
- Take your grass to the Resource Recovery  
Center at 2651 Blackbridge Rd., York, PA 17406.

**(Note: there is a waste disposal fee)**



## **Trash & Recycle Guidelines**

**ALL MOBILE CARTS AND BULK ITEMS MUST BE CURBSIDE BEFORE  
6 AM ON YOUR COLLECTION DAY.**

**ITEMS MAY BE PUT OUT THE NIGHT BEFORE AFTER 5 PM.**

### **TRASH:**

- All residents and businesses utilizing Township refuse collection must use the Penn Waste provided mobile carts. Carts cannot exceed 64-gallons.
- **ONE** trash mobile cart will be emptied twice a week on your collection days. Additional 32-gallon size bags will be accepted if you purchase and place a \$3.00 orange sticker on your extra bag. Stickers can be purchased at the Township office and any Rutter's in the Township.
- Tires are no longer considered a large item. Tires require a \$3 orange sticker on each, and they can be placed out with regular trash.
- No Construction debris will be collected curbside.

### **RECYCLE:**

- All residents and businesses utilizing Township collection must use the Penn Waste provided mobile cart for recycling. Extra carts may be requested for recycling **ONLY**.
- Recycling collection is **once** a week on your designated day. You may place multiple mobile carts out for recycling. **ALL ITEMS MUST BE IN A MOBILE CART OR THEY WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.**
- Plastic bags are no longer accepted as the facility cannot process them.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION:**

For any issues/questions regarding your collection, or to order mobile carts, please contact the Township office at 717-792-3505. If your trash/recycle is not collected by 4 pm on your pick-up day, please notify the Township immediately.

## BULK ITEM

### Acceptable Materials

**ONE BULK ITEM ALLOWED TO BE COLLECTED PERMITTED PER WEEK ON YOUR SECOND COLLECTION DAY!**

Appliances, furniture, mattresses, box springs, lawn mowers (oil and gasoline removed), plumbing fixtures such as toilets and sinks, three (3) 4 ft. rolls of carpet (tied).

### Non-Acceptable Materials

Electronic Waste, (computers, televisions, etc.) chemicals, stains, liquids, batteries, automobile parts, hazardous waste, tires on rims, commercial/ industrial waste, construction materials (drywall, brick, block, lumber, shingles, tiles, concrete).

## HOW TO PREPARE YARD WASTE

**Prepare with any of the following options:**

- In a container, which can be emptied
- In a biodegradable paper bag
- Bundle it with biodegradable twine

**If you choose to bundle your yard waste, please follow these instructions:**

- Bundles are no longer than 5 ft. in length
- Bundles not to exceed 30 lbs. each
- Branches not to exceed 6 inches in diameter

An unlimited number of bags or bundles may be placed at the curb on the scheduled pick up day before 6:00 AM.

By law, as of January 24, 2013, Penn Waste is not allowed to collect your electronic waste.

The Covered Devices Recycling Act prohibits residents and businesses from placing their electronic waste at the curb or in their trash. Covered devices include: desktop computers, laptops, monitors, computer peripherals (keyboard, mouse, printer, and speakers), televisions, or e-readers that browse the internet.

## Looking to do a project?

Call the Zoning Department to get started and obtain a permit!

**Zoning permits fall under Township rules and Ordinances. Building permits are for jobs that fall under the Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code and require inspection. Keep in mind permits take time to review and process. Please allow up to 15 business days for residential permits.**

### examples requiring a ZONING PERMIT

Construction and/or installation of a:

- fence
- shed, unattached carport, unattached garage (under 1,000 sq ft)
- patio, including paver patio or porch with no roof or walls
- walkway on the property other than the sidewalk along the street (that requires a different permit)
- deck under 30" high
- widening, replacing, repaving or adding newly paved areas to an existing driveway



### examples requiring a BUILDING PERMIT

- building an addition onto your house including attached garages and carports
- above, in ground, "wall-less", and portable swimming pools; any pool that can hold 18" needs a permit. If your pool is taken down every year, you need a permit to put it back up
- adding a roof to a patio, porch, or deck where the roof is attached to the house
- construction and/or installation of a deck over 30" high
- installation of doors and windows if they are different sizes
- upgrading an electrical service
- addition or relocation of electrical wiring
- plumbing work where "trap" seal is broken

### examples NOT requiring ANY PERMIT

- repair to existing structures such as floorboards in a deck
- putting new shingles on your roof
- replacing/installing siding on house
- wallpaper, carpet, tile, paint, and interior cabinetry such as kitchen cabinets
- replacing windows and doors with same size
- replacing garage door (however: replacing a manual door with an electrical door will require an electrical permit)



## HIRING A CONTRACTOR?

Once you hire a contractor, but at least **3 weeks** before work is scheduled to begin, the homeowner or the contractor must apply for a permit. Building permits can take up to 15 business days because they are reviewed by a third party agency. If the contractor applies for the permit, the homeowner must ask the contractor for the permit so it may be posted in the window of the residence. If the contractor does not get a permit, the homeowner is still legally responsible.

## SPRINGTIME PROPERTY MAINTENANCE TIPS!

Here are some common "problems" homeowners encounter as the weather gets warmer. Keep on top of these to avoid a letter with possible fines!



- ✓ Remember to mow the grass! Once grass or weeds get higher than 8 inches it is a violation.
- ✓ Old cars or project cars need to be stored indoors. A vehicle that isn't up to date on state inspection, is wrecked, and/or can't run under its own power may not be stored outside!
- ✓ Keep trash, junk and yard debris cleaned up on your property.
- ✓ Campers, RVs, boats and trailers may not be stored in the front yard. This includes the driveway.

## BEFORE YOU BUY A SWIMMING POOL

- ✓ All permanent pools are required to have an operable filtration system utilizing chlorine, bromine or some other antibacterial agent.
- ✓ All swimming pools shall be completely enclosed by a four foot high fence or wall with a self closing gate. This does not apply to above ground pools having a wall measuring four feet in height and having a retractable ladder, or those having less than 18" of water. The fence or wall must be erected and inspected before the pool is filled with water.
- ✓ All pools shall be set back ten feet from property lines measured either from the wall of the pool or any associated decking or concrete aprons.
- ✓ No water from a pool shall be discharged onto any public street or alley nor onto adjoining property.
- ✓ Any pool with the ability to hold water deeper than 18" requires a permit and inspection from the Township - this includes 'big box store' pool kits.
- ✓ Pools may not use extension cords to connect the pump. A single twist lock receptacle may be located between 5 and 10 feet from the pool. A 120 volt convenience outlet shall be located within 10' and 20' of the pool. All receptacles serving the pool and all outdoor receptacles shall be GFCI protected.

## YARD SALES IN WEST MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP

Here's a few rules for holding a successful (and legal) yard sale.

These requirements apply to any sale where numerous items of personal property are offered.

- ✓ **No more than two (2) sales per year, per property**
- ✓ **Each sale may last for two (2) days maximum**
- ✓ **No sale may begin before 9am or go later than 9pm**
- ✓ **Each sign may not be larger than six (6) square feet**

- Signs may be placed on your property or on another person's property (with their written permission).
- ALL SIGNS MUST BE REMOVED WITHIN TWENTY FOUR (24) HOURS AFTER THE END OF THE YARD SALE
- NO SIGNS MAY BE PLACED ON UTILITY POLES OR ON ANY ROAD SIGN

*Failure to abide by these rules may result in a violation letter and a fine up to \$600.*


## What is MS4?

An MS4 (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System) is a network of structures—like storm drains, pipes, ditches, and outfalls—that collects and conveys stormwater runoff from streets, parking lots, and other impervious surfaces. Unlike combined sewer systems, MS4s are separate from sanitary sewers, meaning the stormwater they collect is not treated before being discharged into local water bodies like rivers, lakes, or streams.

## Why MS4's matter?

Stormwater can carry pollutants like:

- Oil and grease from roads
- Fertilizers and pesticides from lawns
- Trash and debris
- Pet waste

## Spring Stormwater TIPS for Residents

### Keep Gutters & Drains Clear

- Clean gutters & downspouts of leaves and debris

### Prevent Runoff & Erosion

- Sweep dirt & grass clippings back into lawns- not on the street

### Manage Rainwater on Your Property

- Extend downspouts to lawns or gardens



## REMINDER!

### Reinstall Your Rain Barrel!



- ✓ Position on a stable base
- ✓ Connect the downspout securely
- ✓ Check spigot and clear debris

## Spring Lawn TIPS for Residents

- Apply fertilizer sparingly
- Avoid fertilizing before rain
- Sweep excess fertilizer off hard surfaces
- Maintain healthy grass for better water absorption
- Aerate your lawn to reduce runoff







## WHAT KINDS OF INFORMATION CAN I PROVIDE?
